On 8/1/69, ALBERT began serving jail sentences in custody of the County Sheriff, Alameda County, California. These sentences are the result of connection for offenses committed on three different dates. The offenses are enumerated in referenced summary report.

County authorities advised on 8/5/69, that ALBERT must serve at least 85 days, beginning 8/1. He also has a fine to pay. If the fine is not paid in full, he may serve up to 226 days.

FD-122, FD-356 and FD-397 submitted changing SI and RI cards to reflect imprisoned status.

UACB, no change is being made in the Key Activist album inasmuch as this change is temporary and ALBERT will probably resume his old residence and employment upon his release.

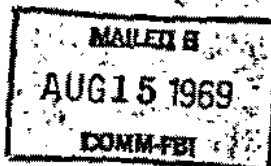

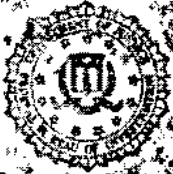

Stewart Edward Albert is a white male, who was born on December 4, 1939, at New York City, New York. He resides at 2917 Ashby Avenue, Berkeley, California, and is a free-lance writer. He writes principally for the so-called "underground newspapers".

On July 30, 1969, [REDACTED]

Albert was scheduled to appear in Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court (BAMC) on August 1, 1969, at which time it was expected that he would be remanded to custody to begin serving sentences previously imposed.

On August 1, 1969, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Albert began confinement at this facility today.

On August 12, 1969, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] furnished the following information:

Stewart Edward Albert was taken into custody on August 1, 1969. He is confined as a result of conviction on charges set forth below.

[redacted] advised that this means that Albert must serve a minimum of 55 days in custody, beginning on August 1, 1969. If the fines are not paid, they must be paid by serving one additional day for each \$5.00.

Albert's arrest on November 30, 1966, occurred on the campus of the University of California at Berkeley (UCB). Albert was one of six prominent non-student radicals who were arrested at the end of a day-long student demonstration. This demonstration had erupted in the vicinity of the Student Union Building on the UCB campus in protest over a U.S. Navy Recruiting Table being manned there by two Naval officers. The demonstrators eventually began a sit-in in the Student Union Building. UCB police officers assisted by police authorities from the City of Berkeley and from the Alameda County Sheriff's Office eventually cleared the sit-in and arrested Albert and five other persons. The six were charged with violation of Sections 372 (PC) (maintaining a public nuisance) and 6021 (PC) (trespass).

At a jury trial held in January, 1967, Albert was found guilty of violation of Section 372. The jury was unable to reach a verdict on the charge of violation of Section 6021.

For conviction of violation of Section 372, Albert was sentenced to 60 days in jail with five days suspended and fined \$330 fine and penalty with \$10 suspended. The conviction was appealed.

On July 24, 1967, the charge of trespass was dismissed at the request of the District Attorney.

Albert's conviction for violation of Section 372 was eventually upheld in higher California courts.

[redacted] has furnished the following information regarding the events leading

STEWART EDWARD ALBERT

to the arrest of Albert on October 24, 1968.

The Academic Senate at UCB, in the past, created a Board of Educational Development (BED) to encourage and provide for more student participation in course structuring at UCB. A Center for Participant Education (CPE) was created, which offered experimental courses beginning in the fall of 1968. Sixteen of these courses were offered for regular credit. One of these sixteen courses was entitled "Dehumanization and Regeneration in the American Social Order." This course was described as "Social Analysis 139X."

During September, 1968, CPE announced that ten of the scheduled 20 lectures of 139X would be delivered by Leroy Eldridge Cleaver, who is publicly known as the Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party (BPP), and who has served time in a California penitentiary for conviction of the crime of rape. This announcement raised a great controversy throughout the State of California. As a result the University of California Regents, at a meeting on September 20, established a rule that guest lecturers (such as Cleaver in this case) would be limited to one appearance per quarter in the classroom.

The Regents' decision angered some of the activist students on the UCB campus. In protest of this decision by the Regents, a generally peaceful sit-in was held on the afternoon and evening of October 22, 1968, in Sproul Hall on the UCB campus. This sit-in was spearheaded by student CPE leaders. Between the hours of approximately 10:30 p.m. and midnight, these persons sitting in were arrested and taken from the building. (Albert was not present at this sit-in.)

The next day the controversy continued on the campus; demonstrators began short, sporadic occupations of campus buildings. At approximately 3:00 p.m., demonstrators began to congregate on Moses Hall, a UCB campus building which houses many offices in the Department of Letters and Science. Demonstrators entered Moses Hall and began to barricade themselves in it. They remained all night until ejected and

arrested at about 6:00 a.m. on October 24, 1968, by police authorities. During these arrests, the police to dismantle barricades and dodge flying objects thrown from within Moses Hall. Three of the arresting officers received minor injuries. One of the 76 persons ejected and arrested was Stewart Albert.

A characterization of the BPP is contained in the Appendix attached hereto.

Albert was charged with violations of Section 415 Penal Code (disturbing the peace), 602j (trespass), and 594 (malicious mischief).

Albert was later tried in BAMC by jury and on February 19, 1969, he was found not guilty of violation of Section 594 and guilty of violation of Section 415. The jury was unable to reach an agreement regarding his guilt or innocence on the charge of violation of Section 602j.

On March 13, 1969, Albert was sentenced to 30 days in the County Jail and to pay a fine of \$250 for his conviction on the charge of disturbing the peace.

On April 17, 1969, his fine was reduced from \$250 to \$200.

Regarding the arrest of Albert on February 21, 1969, authorities at UCB have previously furnished the following information:

On January 22, 1969, a student strike was called against UCB by a group of dissident students. The strike was spearheaded by an organization known as the Third World Liberation Front (TWLF). The TWLF publicly made certain demands of the UCB administration, particularly regarding the establishment of a college of ethnic studies at UCB. The strikers vowed not to return to classes until their demands were met.

THIRD WORLD LIBERATION FRONT

The Third World Liberation Front (TWLF) is a coalition of non-white student groups, namely Black, Chicano (Mexican-American), Filipino, Chinese, and Japanese.

A member of the TWLF was quoted as saying, "The first world is the capitalist world, the second world is the Communist white world, and the third world is the non-white world composed of people from Asia, Africa, and Latin America. The first two worlds suppress the non-white people whether in or out of their own countries. We do not distinguish on national lines. We do not relate to countries because by and large they do not represent people."

TWLF self-described itself as "It opposed the oppressive enslavery and colonialist system in the United States and it was dedicated to preparing for a prolonged struggle for freedom in Asia, Africa, and Latin America as well as the United States."

TWLF stated its purpose is to initiate discussion and develop programs pertinent to the needs of third world (non-white) students; to aid further in developing politically, economically, and culturally the revolutionary "Third World" consciousness of racist-oppressed people; we recognize the struggles for freedom of non-white peoples around the world as a positive part of our educational processes.

Almost immediately the strike action resulted in violence on the campus. Striking students, assisted by non students, blocked entrances to the campus and prevented by force persons from crossing the picket lines. The UCB police, assisted by law enforcement officers from other agencies, were used to quell disturbances and restore order on and near the picket lines. On many occasions officers were attacked with rocks, cherry bombs, broken glass, and other weapons. Injuries ensued to both strikers and police, and considerable property damage was done on the campus.

On January 30, 1969, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] observed Albert to be one of the persons obstructing foot traffic. This matter was later referred to the District Attorney's Office, and a warrant was issued, charging Albert with violation of Section 647c Penal Code (obstructing a public street or walkway).

On February 21, 1969, Albert was observed on the UCB campus and the warrant was executed.

By August 1, 1969, all necessary legal steps had been concluded and Albert was taken into custody to begin serving his sentence on the above three charges.

ALBERT continues to reside at 2917 Ashby Avenue, Berkeley, Calif., and to work as a free-lance writer. On 8/1/69, ALBERT entered Alameda County Jail for a minimum of 85 days in custody after conviction on three charges. Subject still married to JOANN WEILER, but lives with JUDITH CLAVIR HEMBLEN. ALBERT traveled to New York 7/69, with possible intention of overseas travel, but this did not materialize. Subject in close and frequent contact with Black Panther Party and its leaders, has spoken at BPP rallies. Subject appeared on programs at two Southern Calif. colleges, 5/69. ALBERT and others reportedly attempting to begin a school of revolution from his residence. Writings set forth.

A characterization of the SDS is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

B. Employment

ALBERT considers himself to be primarily a writer. He submits work to the so-called "underground newspapers." The "Berkeley Tribe" publishes a good deal of his news stories and articles. The "Berkeley Tribe" is a recently founded weekly newspaper published in Berkeley by an organization known as "The Red Mountain Tribe." The Red Mountain Tribe is a group of former employees of the "Berkeley Barb," a three-year-old "underground" weekly newspaper published in Berkeley. The "Barb" employees became disgruntled with management practices and wages at the "Barb," and quit to form their own group for the purposes of publishing another newspaper. ALBERT is a member of the Red Mountain Tribe.

C. Identification Record

On August 12, 1969, [REDACTED] Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court, Berkeley, California, advised that ALBERT was taken into custody on August 1, 1969, by the Alameda County Sheriff. He is presently confined at the Sheriff's Rehabilitation Center at Santa Rita, California,

On July 25, 1969 [REDACTED] Passport Office, U. S. Department of State, New York City, advised that on July 25, 1969, at New York, ALBERT applied for a U. S. passport. On his application, ALBERT indicated that his marriage to JOANN WEILER has not been terminated.

[REDACTED] a white female, was observed by a Special Agent of the FBI on the campus of the University of California at Berkeley (UCB) in December, 1966, as she worked at the campus Progressive Labor Party (PLP) literature table. *calif*

A characterization of the Bay Area PLP (BAPLP) is contained in the appendix attached hereto,

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Investigation by [REDACTED] on July 28, 1969, at the Passport Office, U.S. Department of State, determined that ALBERT was issued Passport Number K-1255037 at New York on July 28, 1969. This passport is valid for five years.

On July 29, 1969, [REDACTED], John F. Kennedy (JFK) International Airport, New York, furnished the following information.

STEWART ALBERT made a reservation on TWA Flight Number 804, New York to Paris, for the evening of July 28, 1969. He made the reservation earlier on July 28. When ALBERT made this reservation, he inquired regarding connections from Paris to Algiers.

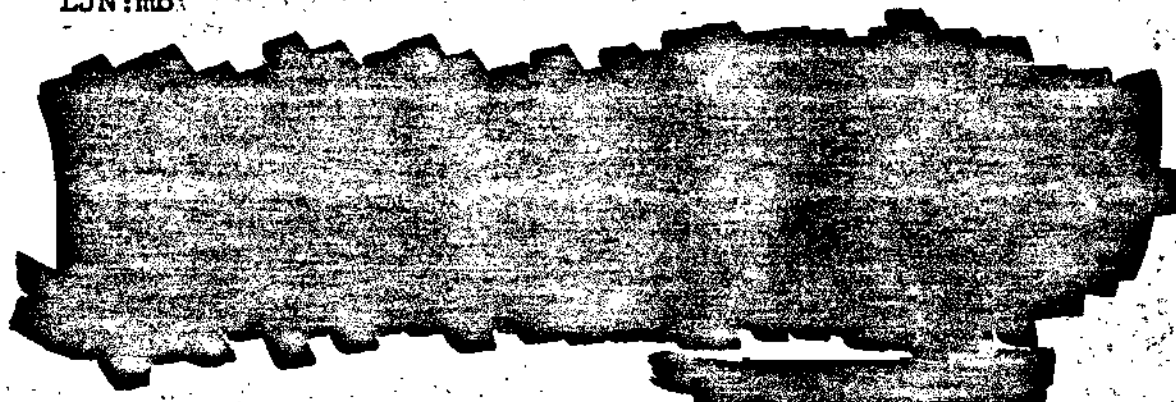
ALBERT's reservation was confirmed. Later in the day, however, the reservation was cancelled, and ALBERT did not appear for the flight.

On July 29, 1969, [REDACTED] advised that a reservation was made for a Mr. ALBERT on AA Flight Number 49, departing JFK at 11:30 PM on July 28, destined for San Francisco.

II. ACTIVITIES

A. Connections with the BPP



The "Chicago Eight" are eight persons indicted for conspiracy to violate, and the violation of, Federal law pertaining to interstate travel in aid of riot. This indictment arose from the actions of the eight in connection with the August, 1968, National Convention of the Democratic Party. STEWART ALBERT was not indicted as a defendant with these eight, but was named in the indictment as a co-conspirator. One of the eight defendants is BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, publicly known as the BPP Chairman.

During the period 12:50 PM through 2:00 PM on April 22, 1969, the BPP held a "rally" in Civic Center Park, Berkeley. The purpose of the rally was to demonstrate support for DAVID HILLIARD, a BPP member who was scheduled to appear in Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court at 2:00 PM that day. About 60 persons attended this rally. The featured speakers were BOBBY SEALE and STEWART ALBERT. Both speakers called for the people to become more revolutionary, and to follow the program of the BPP.

Calif



 furnished a leaflet which called for a mass rally on May 1, 1969, at the Federal Building, 450 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California. The leaflet termed May 1 as "Free Huey Day" and urged: "All Workers and Students - Don't Work or Go To School - Come See About Huey".

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The leaflet stated that this rally was being held in connection with the hearing to be held that day in the Federal Building before U.S. District Judge ALFONSO J. ZIRPOLI.

The leaflet listed a number of scheduled speakers for the rally. One of the speakers listed on the leaflet is "STU ALBERT, Int'l Liberation School".

HUEY P. NEWTON, ^{Calif.} publicly known as one of the founders of the BPP, was, as of May, 1969, serving a sentence in a California prison for conviction of the crime of manslaughter. NEWTON was involved in a shooting incident in October, 1967, in Oakland, California, which resulted in the death of an Oakland police officer. NEWTON was subsequently convicted of manslaughter as a result of this shooting. Judge ZIRPOLI scheduled a hearing in the NEWTON matter for May 1, 1969, and ordered state authorities to show cause for denying NEWTON's release on bail while further appeals in his case were pending.

During the noon hour of April 23, 1969, the usual "noon rally" was held on the steps of Sproul Hall on the campus of the University of California at Berkeley (UCB). The topic of the rally was "freeing" HUEY P. NEWTON and a rally in support of NEWTON which will be held on May 1, 1969, at the Federal Building in San Francisco. One of the speakers at the rally was STEWART ALBERT. [REDACTED] ALBERT facetiously introduced himself as ADLAI STEVENSON III, a friend of (Chicago) Mayor DAILEY".

An article describing the April 23 rally appeared in the April 24 issue of the "Daily Californian". This article quoted ALBERT as stating that "Poetic justice" would be done if NEWTON was set free on "May Day, the anniversary of great revolutions". ALBERT is

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also quoted as saying that the May Day demonstration must show Judge ZIRPOLI "what will happen if the liberals fink out again."

The "Daily Californian" is a campus newspaper published by the Associated Students of the UCB.

The above described rally was held on the plaza of the Federal Building, 450 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, on May 1, 1969.

Special Agents of the FBI observed that ALBERT was approximately the 15th speaker at the rally. ALBERT castigated the "capitalist establishment" for sending young people to their deaths in Vietnam, or to jail, as in NEWTON's case.

CALIF.



During 1969, the BPP began in various locations in the San Francisco area, a so-called "Breakfast for Children" Program. The BPP served free breakfasts to Negro school children.

On June 13, 1969, a Special Agent of the FBI observed as approximately 30 to 35 Negro and white people picketed a Safeway store at 27th and Webb Streets, Oakland.

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Pickets carried signs reading "Safeway Stores Starve Children", "Close Down Safeway", and "Don't Shop Safeway". BPP Chairman BOBBY SEALE, who was on the scene, announced that Safeway was being picketed because Safeway refused to contribute free food to the breakfast program. STEWART ALBERT was present and participating in this picketing.

On June 11, 1969, [REDACTED] furnished leaflet which advertised a "Revolutionary Conference For a United Front Against Fascism in America", to be held on July 18-21, 1969, in Oakland, California. The leaflet stated that the conference was called and organized by the BPP, the International Liberation School, and other committees, organizations and groups. Some of the objectives in developing a united front against fascism were set forth on the leaflet as follows:

- Community control of police on national scale
- freedom of all political prisoners and political freedom
- political program for all the poor, black, oppressed workers and people of America
- military off campus
- self defense

At the end of the leaflet were a number of names of organizations and individuals. It was not stated whether these people were signers of the leaflet, endorsers, or likely participants in the conference. One of the names listed is "STU ALBERT".

B. Other Activity

The "Daily Bruin", campus newspaper of the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) contained an article in its issue of May 8, 1969, pertaining to a

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"Teach-In on Political Repression", which was scheduled for May 13-14 on the UCLA campus. The article stated that after an opening address on "The State of the Movement" on May 13, a panel discussion on the "Student Movement" would be held. The article identified one of the five panelists as "STU ALPERT".

Above teach-in was held, and on May 13, "STU ALPERT" did participate in a panel discussion. Source did not report on the content of this panel discussion or ALPERT's remarks.

"STU ALPERT" identified himself as a leader of the Youth International Party (YIPPIES) in the San Francisco area.

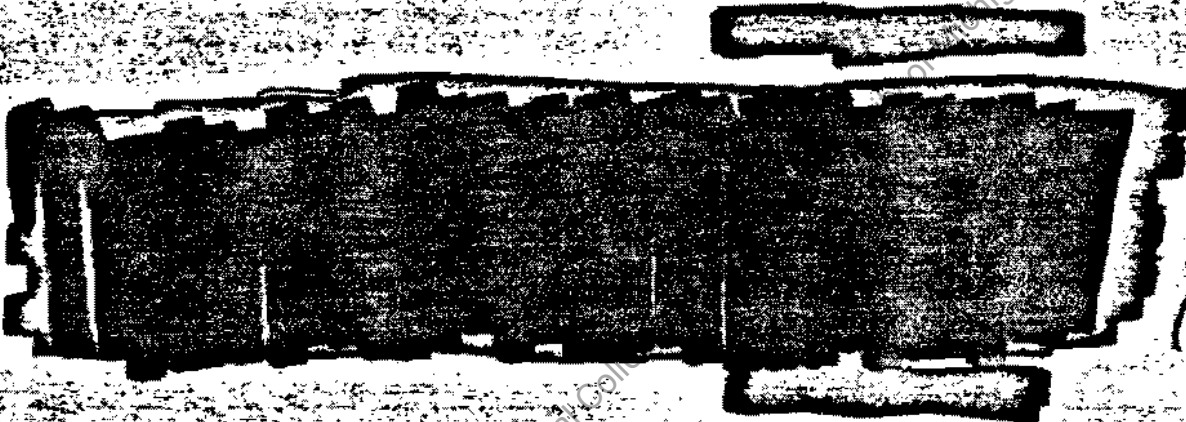
In March, 1968, a leaflet appeared in New York City, which announced the formation of the Youth International Party (YIP). The leaflet stated that a group of 25 artists, writers, and musicians have agreed to participate in the founding of this party. The leaflet stated that YIP will stage a massive youth festival in Chicago during the time of the Democratic National Convention. The leaflet urged people to join YIP in Chicago for a festival of youth, music and theatre. The leaflet did not announce any plans for YIP other than the Chicago activity. One of the persons listed as an original founder of YIP was "STU ALBERT".

On May 26, 1969, SDS sponsored a rally at California State College at Long Beach. STEWART ALPERT

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was one of the rally speakers. ALPERT discussed the current situation at Berkeley regarding the "People's Park" disturbances. He asked the assembled students to come to Berkeley on Memorial Day, May 30, to participate in a demonstration. He stated that people from all over the country were planning to take part in this action. He asked those present to help tear down the fence around "People's Park", adding that, "if they know that all of you are coming from all over the place, they will have to take the fence down, or we'll tear it down".
