Review of Chicago file concerning ALBERT, indicates ALBERT probably released from incarceration in California on or about 10/24/69.



Stewart Edward Albert, a white male, was born December 4, 1939, New York City, New York. He is a co-founder of the Free University of Berkeley, California. Albert is a self-admitted member of the Progressive Labor Party as of 1966, and during the latter part of 1966 he joined the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). Albert has been active in planning and directing anti-Vietnam and anti-draft demonstrations in various parts of the United States. He was a leader in the Chicago Democratic Convention disruption during August, 1968, resulting in his arrest.

On December 12, 1969, Albert was observed by a Special Agent of the FBI during a peaceful demonstration in connection with the Vietnam Moratorium Committee activities on the steps of the U.S. Courthouse, Portland, Oregon. Albert gave a short talk chiefly concerning the conspiracy trials currently taking place in Chicago, Illinois.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

STEWART ALBERT continues to make his permanent address at 2917 Ashby Avenue, Berkeley, California. Since mid-October,

1969, ALBERT has been away from the Berkeley, California, area much of the time. However, he still considers Berkeley to be his home.

B. Employment

ALBERT continues to be employed as free-lance writer. His articles are published primarily by "Underground" newspapers such as "The Berkeley Tribe," and "The Black Panther."

"The Berkeley Tribe" is an underground newspaper published weekly in Berkeley, California.

"The Black Panther" is the official paper of the Black Panther Party (BPP).

A characterization of the BPP is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

C. Identification Record

STEWART ALBERT, who started serving a minimum 55-day sentence on August 1, 1969, at the Alameda County Rehabilitation Center, Santa Rita, California, on local charges, was released from custody on October 4, 1969, after earning credit for an early release.

ALBERT was observed on December 2, 1969, by a Special Agent of the FBI in U. S. District Court, Chicago, Illinois, attending the conspiracy trial of THOMAS HAYDEN.

THOMAS EMMETT HAYDEN is publicly known as one of the original founders of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). He is currently on trial in U. S.

District Court, Chicago, for alleged commission of certain offenses under the Federal Anti-Riot Laws. These alleged offenses occurred during the August, 1968, National Convention of the Democratic Party.

A characterization of the SDS is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

On the same date, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] the Chicago Police Department had an outstanding warrant for ALBERT, charging him with bond default.

ALBERT was arrested on December 3, 1969, by the Chicago Police Department at the Federal Building, Chicago, Illinois, on a warrant charging him with bond default growing out of ALBERT's arrest in Chicago in August, 1968, for disorderly conduct.

By letter dated December 9, 1969, the Identification Division, FBI, advised that ALBERT was arrested on December 3, 1969, by the Chicago Police Department under their number 213339. He was arrested on a bond forfeiture warrant-disorderly conduct. At the time of his arrest, he gave his address as 28 East Jackson Boulevard, Chicago.

The following article, which is reproduced on the next page, appeared on page 6 of the December 12-19, 1969, issue of "The Berkeley Tribe."

of October 15 through 24, 1969, and had travelled to Algeria.

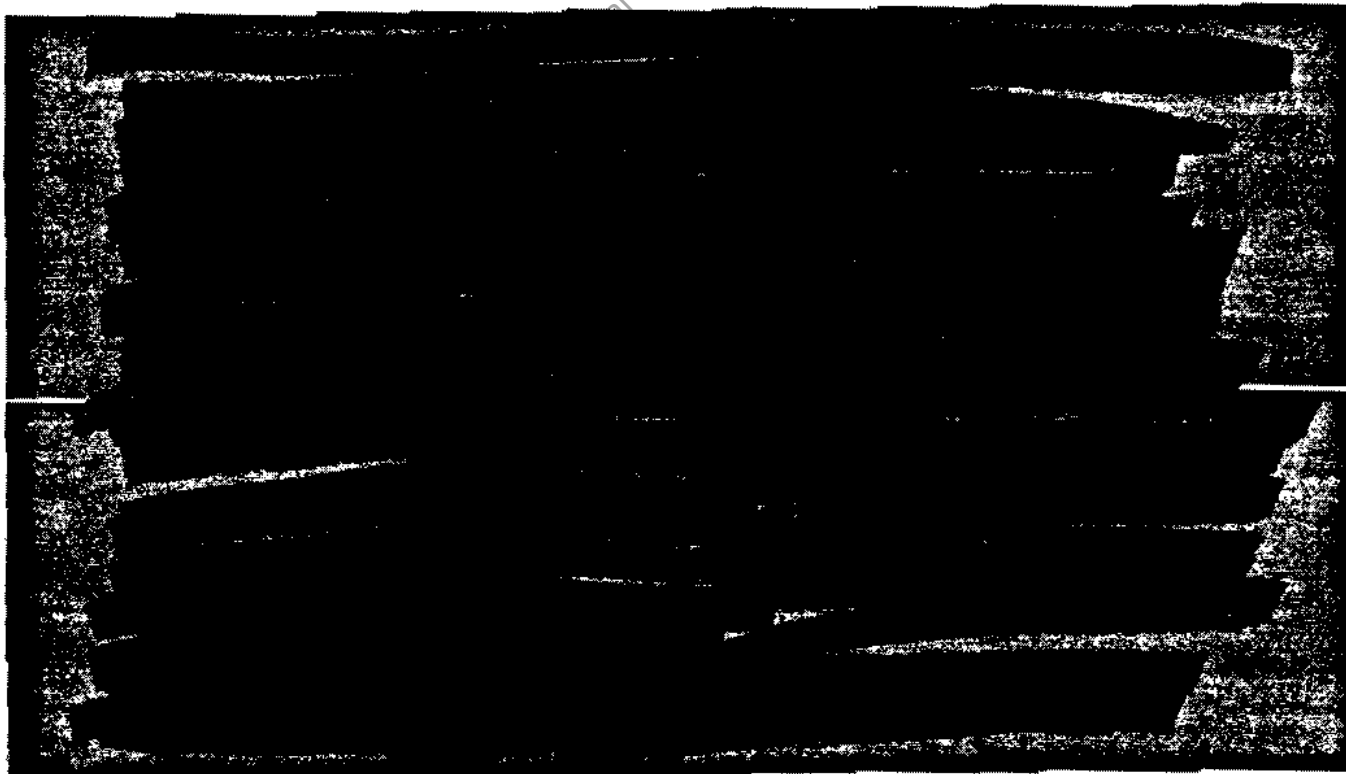

LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER is publicly known as the Minister of Information of the BPP. He is presently a fugitive from justice in the State of California, owing to his failure to comply with conditions of his 1966 parole from a California State penitentiary. An unlawful flight to avoid confinement warrant for his arrest is outstanding in U. S. District Court, San Francisco, California.

ALBERT, immediately upon being released from the Alameda County Rehabilitation Center, Santa Rita, California, in October, departed for Algiers with [REDACTED], via Canada, to meet with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER for 3 weeks. They returned and were in the Washington, D. C., area during the period of November 15, 1969. [REDACTED]

STEWART ALBERT and JUDY HENELIN arrived in Chicago on November 15, 1969, after travelling to Algeria where they were in contact with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER.

In an article published in the January 2-9, 1970, issue of 'The Berkeley Tribe,' entitled "M--- F--- (obscene), Your Ass Is Mine," ALBERT told of his discussion with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER while he and JUDY HENELIN were in Algiers as guests of the International Branch of the BPP.

E. Domestic Travel

An individual believed to be ALBERT, under the name S. ALBERT, left Portland, Oregon, at 7:30 p.m. December 12, 1969, aboard United Airlines Flight 331, scheduled to arrive at Oakland, California, at 9:08 p.m.

The purpose of ALBERT's travelling to the San Francisco area was to meet with ABRAHAM HOFFMAN, who was in Berkeley on the weekend of December 13-14, 1969, and accompany him back to Chicago.

ABBOTT HOWARD HOFFMAN is publicly known as a founder of the Youth International Party, commonly known as the Yippies. He is currently on trial in U. S. District Court, Chicago, for alleged commission of certain offenses under the Federal Anti-Riot Laws. These alleged offenses occurred during the August, 1968, National Convention of the Democratic Party.

In March, 1968, a leaflet appeared in New York City, which announced the formation of the Youth International Party (YIP). The leaflet stated that a group of 25 artists, writers, and musicians have agreed to participate in the founding of this Party. The leaflet stated that YIP will stage a massive youth festival in Chicago during the time of the Democratic National Convention. The leaflet urged people to join YIP in Chicago for a festival of youth, music, and theater. The leaflet did not announce any plans for YIP other than the Chicago activity.

STEVE ALBERT flew to Oakland, California, on the evening of January 2, 1970, on an unknown airline from Chicago, Illinois.

ALBERT was observed by an Agent of the FBI in attendance at the "Chicago Seven" trial in Chicago, Illinois on February 12, 1970.

Subject was subsequently observed by Bureau Agents on February 12, 1970, in the vicinity of the Federal Building, Chicago, Illinois, in the company of [REDACTED] and other unidentified individuals believed to be members of the "Chicago Seven" legal office staff.

On April 22, 1970, ALBERT appeared at an "Earth Day" Rally held at Arizona State University, Tempe, Arizona. The rally was sponsored by a campus group calling itself the Free Speech Movement, (FSM), which was formed for the stated purpose of working to gain adoption by the University of demands which are constitutionally delegated to the students.

ALBERT spoke as part of the campus activities organized to focus attention on pollution and the ways of improving the environment. His comments dealt primarily with pollution and other topics that were related to the "Earth Day" activities with the exception of one reference to the forthcoming murder trial in New Haven Connecticut of BOBBY SEALE, Chairman of the Black Panther Party. ALBERT predicted that if SEALE is convicted, considerable violence would take place.

The Black Panther Party is characterized in the appendix attached hereto.

ALBERT also made a comment to the effect that some riots are beneficial and as an example he said that the "Chicago Seven" would still be in the penitentiary if it were not for the riots that occurred and the threat of additional riots.

There were no incidents and no violence developed during the rally, which was attended by approximately 300 persons, many of whom appeared to be high school students on the campus to celebrate "Earth Day".

D. Political Activity

On March 20, 1970, ALBERT paid a filing fee in the amount of \$551.76 to the Alameda County Clerk's Office, Oakland, California. This fee, for which the Subject received receipt number E-5196, was to enable ALBERT to run for the office of Sheriff of Alameda County.

On March 20, 1970, the Subject filed a "Declaration of Candidacy" with the County Clerk's Office of Alameda County, Oakland, California. In this document, ALBERT declared himself "a candidate for nomination to the office of Sheriff to be voted for at the primary election to be held June 2, 1970". On this declaration he listed his address as 2917 Ashby Avenue, Berkeley, California and his occupation as a journalist and his employer as "The Berkeley Tribe", 1708 Grove Street, Berkeley, California.

In a space where the candidate can set forth any qualifications he possesses for the office he is seeking, ALBERT inserted, "I served 65 days in Santa Rita Jail for political offenses and was cracked over the head by an Alameda County cop".

The Subject attended a "Stew Albert for Alameda County Sheriff" meeting on March 29, 1970, which was attended by approximately 35 individuals. At this meeting, ALBERT said that he wanted to organize the prisoners at Santa Rita Rehabilitation Center, Pleasanton, California, and stage a strike to put an end to the use of guns at the jail.

In an article on page 1 of the March 24, 1970 issue of the "Berkeley Daily Gazette", a daily newspaper published at Berkeley, California, it was set out that the subject was "campaigning on a program advocating armed

self defense for citizens against police". The article goes on to say that ALBERT promises, if elected, to "arrest (incumbent) Sheriff MADIGAN and charge him with murder". ALBERT is quoted as saying that "the only way for people of all races and ages to protect themselves is by arming themselves and by forming citizen militias. The greatest preserver and creator of freedom is democratic self defense from the police".

In an article on page 5 of the March 21, 1970 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", a daily newspaper published in San Francisco, California, ALBERT described himself as a "yippie emeritus", and a "certified public nuisance". ALBERT is quoted in the article as saying, "The first time I voted, I voted for LBJ. The second time I voted for Jerry Rubin. The third time I voted for myself - its sort of a history of the movement".

JERRY RUBIN was a defendant in the "Chicago Seven" conspiracy trial.

An article appearing on page 1 of the June 4, 1970 issue of the "Berkeley Daily Gazette", set forth the results of the primary election held on June 2, 1970. In the race for Sheriff, Incumbent Sheriff FRANK MADIGAN received 176,971 votes and STEWART ALBERT received 65,198 votes. ALBERT, trying to explain his unexpected showing against MADIGAN, said, "It was a real psychological satisfaction for me to expose how many people hate Sheriff Frank Madigan". He said the large number of votes cast for him represent "anti-police sentiment". ALBERT said that he ran his entire campaign on \$70 and further admitted that most of those voting for him did not know who he was.

The article points out that ALBERT concentrated his campaign at the Santa Rita Rehabilitation Center, where he leafleted visitors to the jail every Sunday. ALBERT told the "Gazette" that he did know precinct work, had no billboard signs, and the only major outlay was the filing fee.

II. WRITINGS BY THE SUBJECT

In the May 11, 1970 issue of "Newsweek" magazine an article concerning new left activities appeared in the national affairs section. Contained in the article, on page 35, was a quote from ALBERT. This is set out as follows:

"Some people think the revolution should get white middle class people to relate to the working class. Others think we should attack physically the institutions of the establishment. Others think we should create a separate culture. We have debates about who is the revolutionary class and how they should organize and who they should organize. But we all agree on one thing: the people decide history. And when the people start moving, we'll see who's right and no hard feelings.

In an article entitled "Weatherman Goes for Weapons" which appeared in the February 1, 1970 issue of "Combat" magazine, ALBERT's name was mentioned in connection with a training school for revolutionaries which was found in Berkeley, California in 1969, by ALBERT and TOM HADEN, "Chicago Seven" defendant.

"Combat" Magazine is published twice monthly by Communications Distribution, Inc., Box 182, Murray Hill Station, New York City, New York.

Students for a Democratic Society is characterized in the appendix attached hereto.

The following are synopses of articles written by ALBERT, all of which appeared in "The Berkeley Tribe" on the date and page indicated.

January 24 - 30, 1970, page 5

In an article entitled, "Piece Now", ALBERT discusses his relationship with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, and how the International Liberation School was formed in Berkeley, California. He urges readers to sign up for classes at the International Liberation School, which started February 1, 1970.

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER is nationally known Black Panther Party leader and is presently a Federal fugitive residing outside of the United States.

The International Liberation School maintains offices at the People's Office, 1925 Grove Street, Berkeley, California and conducts classes in revolutionary theory and tactics.

February 27 - March 6, 1970, Page 5

In an article entitled, "Poisoned Feast", ALBERT discussed the "Chicago Seven" trial. He said at one point that "there was so much rule-breaking and humor it was hard to believe that this wasn't some surrealistic flick which would take about six months to make and then everyone would go home. At times I thought Charlie Chaplin was playing both the yippies and the Great Orange Julius.

March 6 - 13, 1970, Page 9

In an article entitled, "Leary Jail and Bad Vibes", ALBERT praises Dr. TIMOTHY LEARY, who is currently serving a jail term for possession of narcotics. ALBERT stated that "to make an American revolution, we will need both Tim's asset beauty and a 12 gage shotgun". ALBERT characterizes LEARY as a political prisoner and urges that he be freed from custody.

May 29 - June 5, 1970, Page 5

In an article entitled, "Moscow of the Youth Revolution", ALBERT states that "Berkeley used to be the where-its-at center of the American revolution". However, now that revolutionary activity has spread across the nation, Berkeley activists have become "comfortable, liberal, and alienated. Berkeley is too satisfied with a half-life trip".

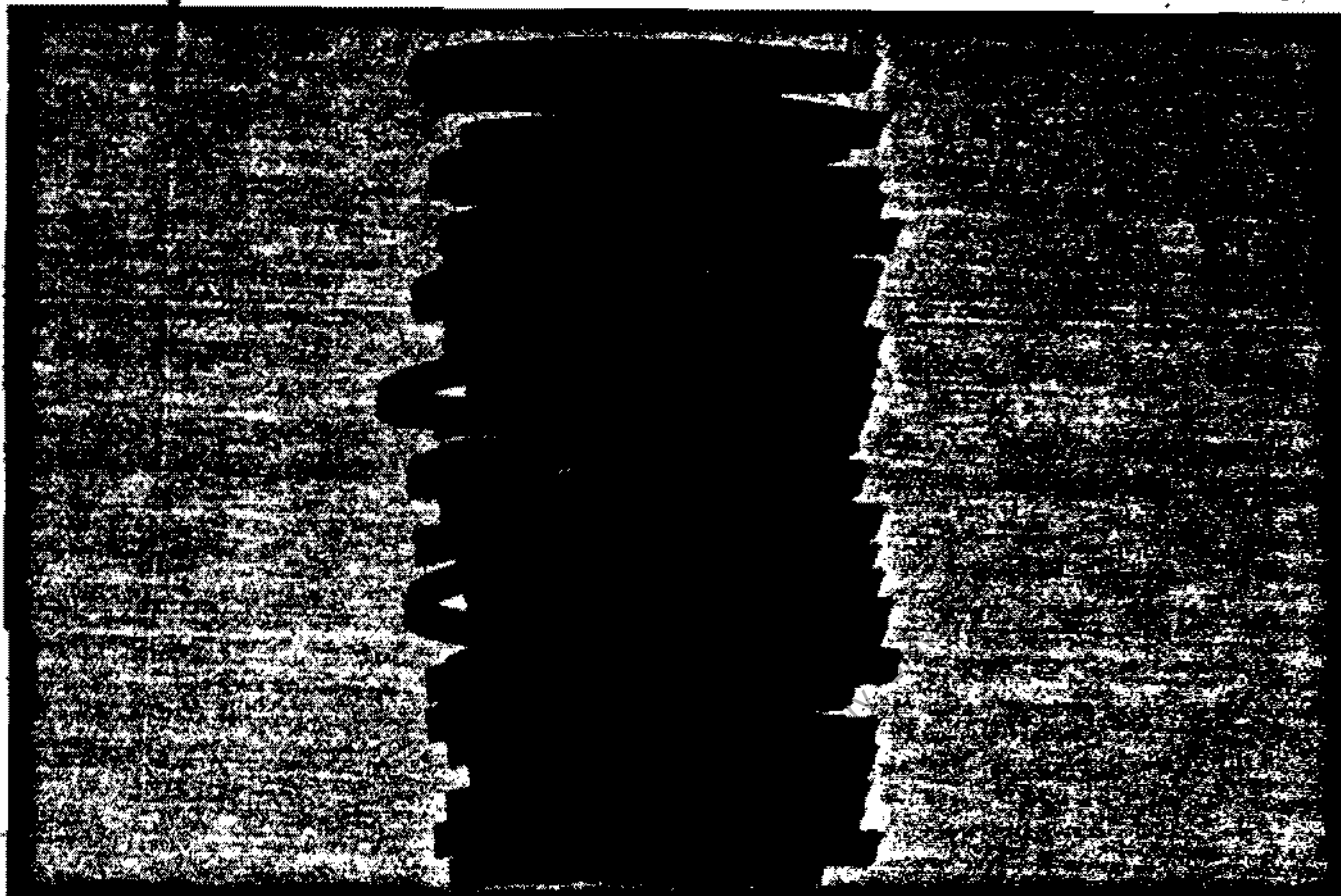

On November 14, 1970, [REDACTED] Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA), New York City (NYC), advised that he learned from [REDACTED] that Jerry C. Rubin and Stewart E. Albert arrived at 4:19 p.m. on that date at JFKIA via British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) Flight 537 from Prestwick, Scotland. He stated Rubin had Passport Number A 1886272 and Albert had Passport Number K 1255037. He stated the passports gave the residences of both Rubin and Albert at 5 St. Marks Place, NYC.

On November 14, 1970, [REDACTED] US Customs, [REDACTED] JFKIA, NYC, advised that a search was made of luggage of Rubin and Albert on that date. He stated the search revealed no subversive literature and that the only literature that was observed was literature that could be bought anywhere in the East Village of NYC. As examples, he stated that Rubin had a booklet entitled, "The Babylon War" by Eldridge Cleaver, and Albert had a book entitled, "The Enemy" by Felix Greene, which had a subheading, "Notes on Imperialism."

JERRY CLYDE RUBIN and STEWART EDWARD ALBERT were observed on the roadway in front of the British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) Terminal at John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA) where both answered questions of the news media for approximately three minutes. RUBIN stated that he had traveled throughout Europe making contacts with member of the Youth International Party (YIP). RUBIN specifically stated that he was in England, Northern Ireland, Germany, Holland and France. RUBIN stated that he was in contact with the Irish Revolutionary Movement in Ireland. RUBIN repeatedly emphasized that he was deported from Britain. He stated that his future plans were secret.

ALBERT stated in response to a question directed to RUBIN concerning the possibility of RUBIN's return to England, that they can go in and out of England at will. ALBERT stated that he met with TIMOTHY LEARY in Algeria and that LEARY is presently writing a book and plans to travel throughout the "Third World". ALBERT stated that he met ELDRIDGE CLEAVER in Algeria and described him as being "in great shape."

RUBIN and ALBERT indicated that they were traveling together while making contacts abroad with YIP members.

II. TRAVEL OF THE SUBJECT

1. The first part of the document is a letter from the author to the reader, dated 1946. It is a personal letter, written in a casual, conversational style. The author discusses his experiences during the war and his feelings about the future of the world. He mentions that he has been thinking about the war a great deal and how it has changed him. He also talks about his hopes for the future and his belief that the world is moving in a better direction. The letter is signed "John F. Kennedy" and dated "1946".

A characterization of the Black Panther Party is contained in the appendix.

STEWART ALBERT accompanied by JERRY CLYDE RUBIN arrived at 4:19 p.m., on November 14, 1970, at John F. Kennedy International Airport, New York City, on BOAC Flight 537 from Prestwick, Scotland. ALBERT had passport number K1255037. His residence was given as 5 St. Marks Place, New York City, and his passport was stamped with an admission for Algeria, France, Germany, England, and Ireland.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

A. "Berkeley Tribe"

The "Berkeley Tribe" is one of the so-called "underground" newspapers, published each Friday in Berkeley by a group of persons self-described as the "Red Mountain Tribe." The paper is devoted to coverage of the entire spectrum of New Left and related activity.

STEW ALBERT, who formerly was on the staff of the "Berkeley Tribe" has been gone from Berkeley for some time and is not expected to return to Berkeley in the near future.

STEWART ALBERT furnished the "Berkeley Tribe" the following story on October 13, 1970. ALBERT authored this story and requested it be in the next issue the "Berkeley Tribe." The story is set forth as follows:

"TIMOTHY LEARY is in Algeria. I last saw him on a very quiet and sunny beach. He and ROSEMARY told me to give you their love and best wishes for revolutionary victory.

"I was in Algeria to get political advice from ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and to make contact for the Youth International Party.

"ELDRIDGE and FIELD MARSHAL D. C. were the hosts but it was time to leave and my suitcase was packed. 'Hey STEW, we can't let you go, TIM LEARY is here,' ELDRIDGE announced.

"My mind was blown. The best dreams a revolutionary madman could have had suddenly became true flesh. The psychedelic revolution broken out of jail and now in the third world making common cause with a black gun.

" 'Hey man, did you levitate over the fence'? I asked.

"LEARY was in my arms. He was disguised as a completely ordinary pig businessman, but the twinkle in his eyes was a dead giveaway. Fortunately the FBI isn't trained to read twinkles.

" 'STEW, this is so beautiful.' 'You know last time I saw ELDRIDGE was on an airplane. He told me to stay out of jail. I should have listened to him.'

" 'Hey crime partner, how you doing'? ELDRIDGE extended his hand and two people who should have gotten together a thousand years ago began exchanging jailhouse memories.

" 'All that propaganda about my digging jail as righteous KARMA was just bullshit! Dr. TIM declared 'We are trying to convince the pigs I was a model prisoner so they wouldn't be afraid to turn their backs. I intended to escape from the first day.

" 'The pigs have absolutely no idea how I got out, and I don't want to give it away but I'll tell you this, I had to lift weights everyday to pull it off. I realized my freedom was the only thing I wanted and was

'willing to kill for it. The need for armed revolution becomes obvious when you spend several months of your existence living among pigs.'

" 'The Weatherman drove my getaway car, but I completely supported them before I knew they were involved in my escape.'

" 'Hey, LEARY, did you spend much time with the Weatherman'? ELDRIDGE inquired.

" 'Yes, we turned on a lot and ROSEMARY and I went to see "Woodstock" with BERNADINE DOLPH and JEFF JONES. We were stoned out of our mind.'

"Dr. TIMOTHY LEARY, former Harvard professor and political prisoner, has been given political asylum by the Algerian government. His request for protection in exile was backed completely by the Black Panther Party. LEARY listed himself as a member of the Youth International Party and the Weatherman.

" 'The same pigs who wanted to ice me are after LEARY. They hate him because he makes their children rebel. Kids want to make love and not kill niggers. That's a crime in Babylon,' ELDRIDGE rapped to an Algerian friend.

"ROSEMARY LEARY working for TIM on the outside has gone through changes.

" 'BERNADINE taught me a lot about women's liberation,' ROSEMARY exuded. 'I want to go back to Amerika, I want to take revenge and fight in the underground.'

" 'What is TIM LEARY going to do in a revolution-ary African country'?

" 'I will write a book about my prison life and conversion. I'll do a regular column for the underground press and I want to go to Hanoi. Naturally I will accept totally the discipline of the Black Panther Party.'

" 'We used to quote from the I CHING,' ROSEMARY stated, 'but now it's going to be YIN IL SUNG and the thought of Chairman MAO.'


"ROSEMARY and TIM will be renting a house in the Algerian countryside. They would like their friends to visit them but time is limited so write first.

"Our revolution has taken an inevitable turn.

"In Algeria the gun protects the flower.

"In Algeria the flower becomes the gun."

ALBERT also remarked that LEARY was bald but that this fact should not be included in the story. ALBERT stated that the LEARYs have plenty of "acid." ALBERT also stated that his remark in the story about being in Algeria to get political advice from CLEAVER and to make contact for the Youth International Party was "...give but I've got to have it."

[REDACTED] identified themselves as being Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and stated that they would like to interview Mr. ALBERT. ALBERT stated that he was willing to be interviewed, but that he would like to get a cup of coffee before he made any statements.

Mr. ALBERT and [REDACTED] proceeded to Tom's Restaurant, 112th Street and Broadway, New York, New York, where the interview was instituted. Mr. ALBERT was furnished with an Interrogation; Advice of Rights form which he read, stated that he understood, and advised that he was willing to be interviewed without his attorney being present. However, ALBERT stated that he would not sign the form. Mr. ALBERT furnished the following information:

Mr. ALBERT stated that he went to Washington, D.C. on either February 24, 1971 or February 25, 1971 by Greyhound Bus. That while in Washington, D.C. he stayed in the May Day Tribe commune, which is on M Street across from a fire station. He stated that several other people stayed at the May Day commune but that he would not answer questions about other people.

ALBERT stated that his purpose in going to Washington, D.C. was to prepare a newsletter calling on young people to come to Washington, D.C. on May 1, 1971 to protest the war in Vietnam. He stated that this type of newsletter was not unusual for him since he is by profession a writer and a editor.

ALBERT was asked if he had any information that he could furnish regarding the bombing of the United States Capitol. ALBERT replied that he knew nothing about the bombing except what he had read in the newspaper and heard on the radio. He advised that while in Washington, D.C. he

heard no mention of a planned bombing and since he has returned to New York, New York, he has not heard anything regarding individuals who may have bombed the Capitol. ALBERT advised that he had never been involved with explosives and know nothing about the use of explosives. He stated that bombing was against his political philosophy. ALBERT further advised that he had stayed at the May Day Tribe commune exclusively while in Washington, D.C. because The Newsletter required his undivided attention. He refused to name anyone else who stayed at the commune.

Mr. ALBERT stated that he left the Washington, D.C. area and traveled by automobile in the afternoon of March 1, 1971. He refused to describe the automobile but stated "you know the car." He stated that he was aware that he was being followed from the time he left Washington, D.C. He advised that in the state of Pennsylvania he was stopped by Pennsylvania police and that he and the occupants were ordered out of the automobile he was traveling in at gun point and was searched. When asked the identity of the other occupants, ALBERT stated that he would rather not furnish their names. He stated that after being stopped by the police, he proceeded directly to New York City.

Mr. ALBERT stated that he had no idea who bombed the Capitol, but that he had read the Weatherman Communique and that he thought that the bombing had been done by the Weathermen. ALBERT stated that he had never been a Weatherman and that he now has no contact with members of the Weatherman Faction or the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) but that he had read many Weatherman communications in the past and judged this one to be authentic.

ALBERT stated that he has been in New York, New York about six months and that he had no plans to leave in the near future. He advised that he was currently in the process of having a book entitled "You" published, which he said consists of letters from young people throughout the country, concerning life in America. He advised that he would not leave New York, New York, until the book was published and was uncertain where he would live after leaving New York City.

MOVEMENT SPEAKERS BUREAU

On August 14, 1969, a source made available a two-page undated letter from the Movement Speakers Bureau (MSB), 333 East 5th Street, New York City, which disclosed that the MSB was at that time being created to replace legitimate national speakers bureaus for booking "movement" speakers on college campuses for the financial benefit of the "movement." In addition to providing a catalog of speakers, the MSB will also have an advisory board of well-known activists to help to introduce the Bureau to college agencies and other possible sources of speaking engagements.

On October 17, 1969, GEORGE DEMMERLE, who was active in various New York based radical groups during the period 1967 to November, 1969, advised that the MSB was organized by ABBIE HOFFMAN.

On February 18, 1970, ABBIE HOFFMAN was found guilty in the United States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, for violating the Federal Anti-Riot Law Statute for traveling in interstate commerce from outside the state of Illinois with intent to incite riots in Chicago, Illinois, during the Democratic National Convention in August, 1968. On February 20, 1970, he was sentenced to 5 years imprisonment and fined \$5,000. On February 28, 1970, the United States Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, Chicago, Illinois, ordered him released on \$25,000 bond pending appeal of his conviction.

On May 7, 1970, a second source advised that the MSB is located in a ground floor apartment at 333 East 5th Street, New York City.

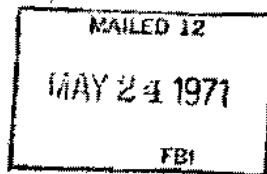

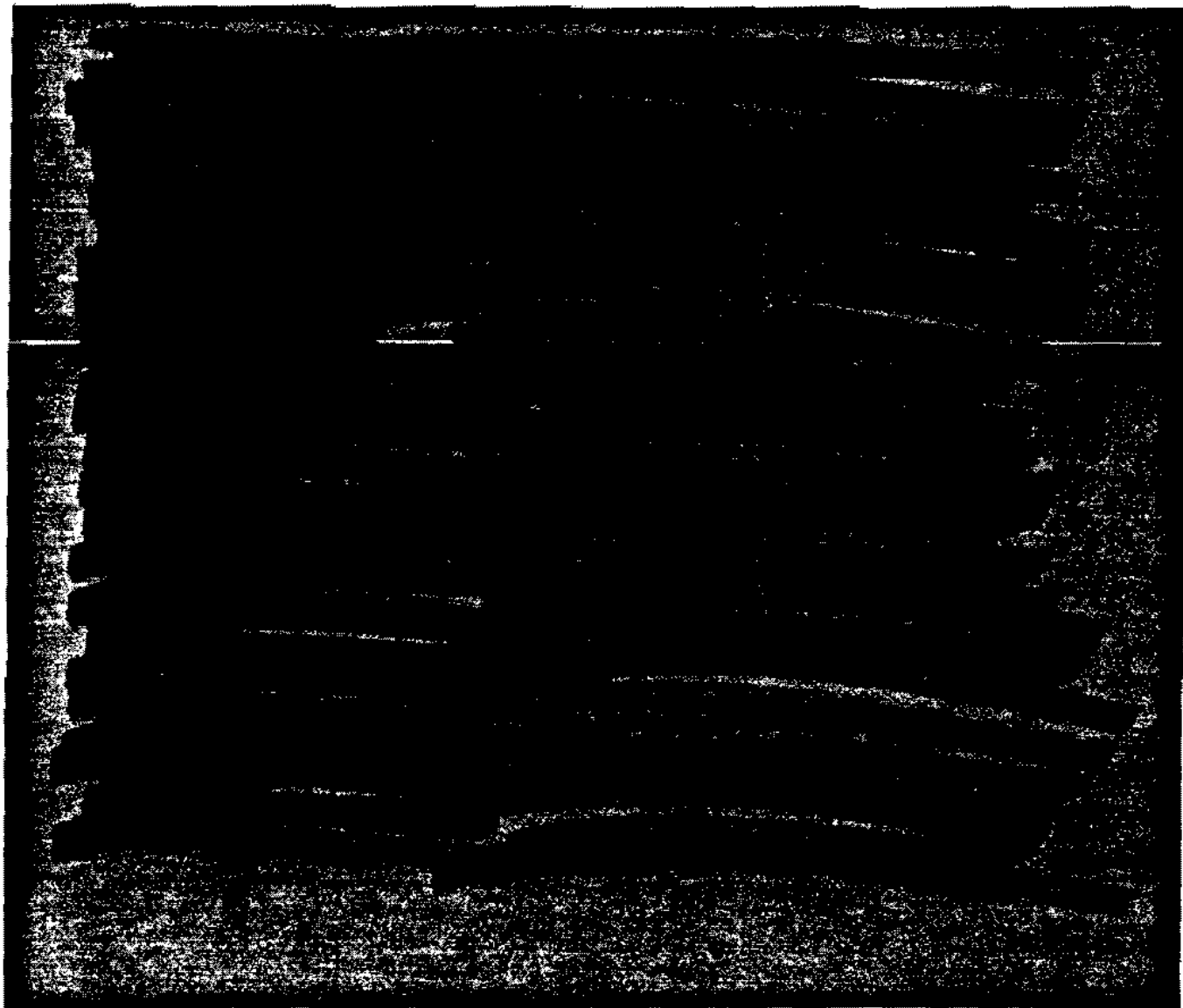

Synopsis: ALBERT not known to have been in NYC since early March, 1971, with exception of appearances under subpoena on 5/27, 6/8 and 6/15/71. ALBERT has expressed intention of making Berkeley, California, his base of operations. A confidential source advised on 5/19/71 that ALBERT was residing at 2355 Hilgard, Apartment 204 Berkeley. ALBERT traveled to Utica-Syracuse, NY area and to Tampa, Florida in late April, 1971, speaking in behalf of May Day Demonstrations. He reportedly has hopes of taking over YIP and making it more militant. ALBERT subpoenaed to appear before FGJ, SDNY, on 5/27/71 and 6/8/71 in connection with conspiracy to firebomb First National City Bank of NY on 12/4/70. Subpoena set aside because of Government's unwillingness to litigate electronic surveillance issue. ALBERT present at demonstration and obstruction of US Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. on 4/30/71. ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

On March 23, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT had been staying at the residence of [REDACTED], 670 Ensenada Avenue, Berkeley, California and at the Good Times Commune, 2377 Bush Street, San Francisco, since his arrival in that area on March 15, 1971.

The "San Francisco Good Times" is one of the so called underground newspapers published each Friday in San Francisco, California, calling themselves the Good Times Commune. This paper is devoted to coverage of the entire New Left spectrum and related activities.

[REDACTED] advised that they had not seen subject in more than three weeks.

On May 19, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT was allegedly using 2355, Hilgard, Apartment 204, Berkeley, California as his address.

[REDACTED] NYC has been recontacted on several occasions during the months of April, May, June and July, 1971, and he has advised that he has not seen ALBERT since last March.

II. ACTIVITIES

On March 15, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT was picked up at the San Francisco International Airport, on that date by JERRY CLYDE RUBIN, and was taken to the Good Times Commune, 2377 Bush Street, San Francisco, California.

JERRY CLYDE RUBIN is publicly known as a member of the Chicago Seven and a leader of the Youth International Party (YIP).

The YIP also known as Yippies is publicly known as a loosely-knit, anti-establishment, revolutionary youth organization formed in New York City in January, 1968.

On March 19, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT was observed attending an informal meeting of the Good Times Commune.

On March 23, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT planned to drive to Madison, Wisconsin, to attend the Youth International Party (YIP) Convention in hopes of taking over the party and making it more militant.

[REDACTED] advised that ALBERT and RUBIN planned to make Berkeley, California, their base of operations in the near future.

On March 15, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT was observed at a gathering at 670 Ensenada Avenue, Berkeley, California, along with JERRY RUBIN, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

On April 15, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT attended a Yippie meeting at the home of [REDACTED].

On April 17, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT attended a Weatherman underground first anniversary party which was held at Speedway Meadows, Golden Gate Park, San Francisco, California.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students For A Democratic Society (SDS), controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969 until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage", with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

SDS functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States in the 1960s. From a stance of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position.

Records [REDACTED] indicate that RUBIN and ALBERT departed San Francisco on Flight 56 at 11:00 PM, April 18, 1971, enroute to Washington, D.C. The flight was bound for Washington, D.C. with a connecting Mohawk Flight due to arrive at Utica, New York, April 19, 1971.

On April 19, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT and RUBIN were traveling to the Utica - Syracuse, New York area to promote participation in demonstrations at Washington, D.C.

On April 27, 1971, ALBERT was observed by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), speaking on the mall of the University of South Florida, Tampa, Florida, to a crowd of about 500 students. ALBERT spoke humorously of his recent experiences and called on the students to join him in Washington, D.C. during the "May Day" activities and help close the government down.

On May 21, 1971, "The Berkeley Daily Gazette", a daily newspaper published at Berkeley, California, contained an article under the byline of UPI, New Haven, Connecticut. The article stated that STEWART ALBERT was interviewed outside the courthouse where the trial of Black Panther Party (BPP) leader, BOBBY SEALE, was being held. The article continued that ALBERT advised he spent the night of the Capitol bombing in Washington, D.C., with LESLIE BACON and that neither he nor BACON were involved in the planning or execution of the Capitol bombing.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is an extremist organization started in Oakland, California in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

LESLIE BACON has been publicly known as a member of the YIP and is currently under Federal indictment for conspiracy to firebomb the First National City Bank, 91st Street and Madison Avenue, New York City, on December 4, 1970.

On May 21, 1971, while in the hallway of the Superior Courthouse, New Haven, Connecticut, ALBERT was served with a subpoena by Special Agents of the FBI. The subpoena directed ALBERT to appear on May 27, 1971, at 2:00 PM at the United States District Court (USDC), Southern District of New York (SDNY), New York, New York and give testimony before a Federal Grand Jury in regard to alleged conspiracy to firebomb the First National City Bank, 91st Street and Madison Avenue, on December 4, 1970.

ALBERT was observed by Special Agents of the FBI to appear at USDC, SDNY at 2:00 PM on May 27, 1971, in response to aforementioned subpoena. Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) JOHN H. DOYLE III advised that by agreement between himself and defense counsel, the hearing was adjourned until June 8, 1971.

On June 8, 1971, ALBERT was observed by Special Agents of the FBI at a demonstration at Foley Square, New York City, protesting the issuance of subpoenas ordering ALBERT and others to appear before the Federal Grand Jury in connection with the fire bombing of a First National City Bank branch at 91st Street and Madison Avenue, New York City.

On June 15, 1971, ALBERT was observed by Special Agents of the FBI at another rally in Foley Square. ALBERT was again present in the area under the aforementioned subpoena.

On June 23, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT was present during the afternoon of April 30, 1971, at a demonstration and obstruction outside of the United States Department of Justice, Washington, D.C.

On June 29, 1971, AUSA JOHN H. DOYLE III, SDNY, advised that subpoenas issued to ALBERT and others to appear before the Federal Grand Jury at New York City had been set aside to avoid litigating the issue of electronic surveillance in connection with the issuance of the subpoenas.
