STEWART EDWARD ALBERT

On March 13, 1971, Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed STEWART EDWARD ALBERT at a demonstration in support of Black Panther Party Chairman BOBBY SEALE at the New Haven Green, New Haven, Connecticut. ALBERT was a spectator during the speeches and then took part in a march at New Haven Courthouse where SEALE was tried. During the demonstration, ALBERT was overheard to say that he would be returning to New York that night.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

On the dates May 18, 1971 through May 21, 1971, ALBERT was observed on the New Haven Green and in the New Haven Superior Courthouse by Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was participating in a vigil awaiting the results of the trial.

At 3:25 pm on May 21, 1971, Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation served a subpoena upon the person of STEWART EDWARD ALBERT in the hallway of the Superior Courthouse, New Haven, Connecticut, where ALBERT was participating in a vigil awaiting the verdict in the trial of BPP Chairman BOBBY SEALE. ALBERT accepted the subpoena without incident in the presence of Attorney DAVID ROSEN.

Afterwards on the New Haven Green, ALBERT was witnessed by [redacted] to submit to interview by CBS reporters at which time ALBERT advised that he had been served with subpoena by "Mr. HOOVER's Whizz Kids" and then ALBERT allegedly burned the subpoena saying "so much for the government."

Sources who are in a position to know advise that ALBERT has not been in New Haven since his departure after being served with subpoena on May 21, 1971; the same sources advised that while in New Haven, he stayed at 18 Eld Street, the local headquarters for the Committee to Defend the Black Panthers, an organization that sponsors rallies in support of BOBBY SEALE and which sponsored the vigil awaiting the verdict in the trial.

Reference is made to Chicago memorandums dated July 20 and 27, 1971.

Referenced memorandum dated July 27, 1971, stated that Luther Swygert, Chief Judge, United States Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, Chicago, Illinois, had issued an order granting Rubin permission to travel to Chile from July 23, 1971 to September 15, 1971.

Rubin resides at Apartment D506, 463 West Street, New York, New York (NY), and is a writer from residence. On October 21, 1970, he was issued passport number A-1886272 which is valid for five years.

On July 29, 1971,

[redacted] New York City (NYC), advised that flight reservations were made by Travel Horizons Unlimited, NYC, (telephone number 607-5121) for J. Rubin (telephone number 989-7063) and S. Albert, from NYC to Santiago, Chile. He stated that both are to depart John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA), NYC, at 9:00 p.m., August 2, 1971 via Eastern Airlines Flight 401 for Miami and are to arrive at Miami at 11:35 p.m. They are to depart Miami at 2:00 a.m.,

On July 29, 1971, [REDACTED] NYC, advised that Rubin and Albert had confirmed reservations for Eastern Airlines Flight 401 from NYC to Miami for August 2, 1971.

On August 2, 1971, [REDACTED] advised that J. Rubin has standard ticket number 495-767-145 and S. Albert has standard ticket number 495-767-146 for the above mentioned flights.

The current Manhattan, NYC Telephone Directory lists Travel Horizons Unlimited at 511 5th Avenue, NYC, telephone number 687-5121. The Manhattan Address Telephone Directory lists telephone number 687-5121 to [REDACTED] travel bureau, 511 5th Avenue, NYC.



On August 2, 1971, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed Jerry Clyde Rubin and Stewart Edward Albert depart JFKIA, NYC, at 9:25 p.m. via Eastern Airlines Flight 445 for Miami, which was due to arrive in Miami at 2:52 a.m., August 3, 1971. Rubin and Albert arrived at the airport at 9:15 p.m., August 2, 1971 and missed their originally planned Flight 401 at 9:00 p.m.

[REDACTED] NYC, advised that both Rubin and Albert had open (no reservations) one-way tickets to Miami. He stated that Flight 415 makes stops at Atlanta at 11:39 p.m., August 2, 1971 and at Tampa at 1:36 a.m., August 3, 1971 with 30 to 45 minute stops at both Atlanta and Tampa.

Rubin was observed wearing multi-colored shirt (black, green and blue), blue dungaree pants, and shoulder length hair with full beard.

Albert wore a dark leather coat, light shirt, dark dungaree pants, cowboy boots, shoulder length stringy blond hair, mustache and goatee.

On August 3, 1971, it was determined at Atlanta, Georgia that Rubin and Albert purchased tickets for Eastern Airlines Flight 455, a non-stop flight to Miami, with scheduled departure time of 12:40 a.m., August 3, 1971, and also made plans to take Braniff Airlines Flight 979 from Miami to Santiago, Chile.

At 2:45 a.m., August 3, 1971, a Special Agent of the FBI observed Rubin and Albert arrive at Miami International Airport on Eastern Airlines Flight 455 from Atlanta. They proceeded to Braniff International (BI) ticket counter and after having tickets validated, boarded BI Flight 979. This flight departed Miami at 3:30 a.m., bound for Panama City, Quito, Lima, La Paz and Santiago and is scheduled to arrive at Santiago, Chile at 4:50 p.m., August 3, 1971.

On August 3, 1971, [REDACTED]

J. Rubin and S. Albert presented round-trip thirty-day excursion tickets under these names, which tickets were purchased in NYC from Travel Horizons Unlimited, 511 5th Avenue. The tickets were purchased on August 2, 1971 at cost of \$468 each, which did not include travel from NY to Miami. They are for travel from Miami to Santiago, Santiago to La

Paz, La Paz to Lima and Lima to Miami. All tickets open (no reservations). Excursion rates require passengers return to Miami in not less than 14 days and not more than 30 days from date of departure. Albert carried a small canvass handbag and one other bag was checked onto flight in NY.

[REDACTED] asked subjects if they knew anyone in Santiago and Rubin replied "Not yet." Remainder of conversation concerned weather in Santiago and other small talk. Subjects gave no indication that purpose of trip was for anything other than pleasure.

Stewart Albert

On April 25, 1966, a second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stewart Albert was arrested on April 12, 1966 at Berkeley, California along with other Progressive Labor Party (PLP) members while demonstrating in front of the Berkeley City Hall.

9/13/71 stated that motion was filed 9/10/71 with US Court of Appeals, Chicago, requesting permission for RUBIN to travel to Toronto, Canada on 9/26/71 to participate in taping a TV show to be later telecast over station CFTO-TV, in Toronto. RUBIN will not remain in Toronto overnight and will return to the US on same date. (No response has been received concerning this motion to date.)

It is noted that RUBIN and STEWART ALBERT originally had 30-day round-trip excursion tickets, which did not include travel to NY to Miami. On 8/3/71, they departed Miami via Braniff International (BI) Flight 979, bound for Panama City, Quito, Lima, La Paz and Santiago. Their return tickets, although now expired, provided for travel from Santiago to La Paz, La Paz to Lima and Lima to Miami.

To date, NY sources are unable to furnish any information concerning RUBIN's or ALBERT's return to NYC.

Because of mechanical trouble, all passengers were scheduled to be transferred to Eastern Airlines Flight 16, which was to arrive in NYC at 2:33 p.m. at John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA).

The PLP was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese Communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

On September 27, 1971, a second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that J. Ruben (Jerry Rubin) left LaGuardia Airport, NYC, for Toronto, Canada on September 26, 1971 via American Airlines Flight 354 and was scheduled to return to NYC at 8:10 p.m. on Flight 412 the same day. Reservations were made by the Travel Shop Agency at Toronto.

On September 27, 1971, the above source stated that he had learned that the Canadian officials were "not very hospitable" to Rubin and made him return on the next flight to NYC at 4:50 p.m., September 26, 1971, on American Airlines Flight 377, which arrived at LaGuardia Airport, NYC, at 6:03 p.m., September 26, 1971.

Toronto, contained an article captioned, "Canada Gives Rubin the Boot." The article states as follows:

"Yippie leader Jerry Rubin has been deported to the U.S. for 'non-compliance with Canadian immigration regulations concerning non-residents,' an immigration official at Toronto International Airport says.

"The official did not elaborate, except to say that Rubin arrived at about 1 p.m. yesterday and was placed on a return flight to New York soon thereafter.

"Rubin said he had flown to Toronto to appear on a television show, 'Newsmakers Match,' a CFTO-TV syndicated program, on which panelists try to guess the identity of the guest by asking questions. Once identified, the guest is interviewed by the panel."

Page 5 of the August 25, 1971 issue of "The East Village Other," a NYC bi-monthly newspaper, contained an article by Jerry Rubin captioned, "From Chile With Love!" A Xerox copy of this article follows:

ReNYairtel dated 10/21/71, captioned "CAPBOM."

Referenced airtel noted Albert's return from South America on 9/24/71, stated that Albert "has not surfaced since 9/24/71" and requested San Francisco to contact sources in Berkeley to determine whether he has returned to the Berkeley, California, area.

As recipients are aware, one of the principal requirements (as repeatedly noted in Bureau communications) concerning the investigation of activities of Key Activists, is adequate informant coverage. The contents of referenced airtel would appear to indicate that rather than by developing live informant coverage, receiving offices are attempting to cover Albert's activities via information appearing in the news media.

It is realized that Albert's travels and itinerant residential habits create difficulties in being knowledgeable of his whereabouts at all times. It is nonetheless imperative that live sources be developed in the immediate vicinity of his known places of previous residence: for example, [REDACTED] apartment in New York City, [REDACTED] residence in Berkeley, California, and the Good Times Commune in San Francisco, California.

Within the past year, Albert, a free-lance writer, has visited Europe and the Middle East, often in the company of fellow Yippies Abbie Hoffman and Jerry Rubin. During his recent trip to Santiago, Chile, with Jerry Rubin, the pair were in contact with South American New Leftists. In 1963, Albert was declared not qualified for Armed Forces

He has been uncooperative in interview, reportedly is in possession of firearms and in 1968 claimed people must learn how to shoot in order to protect themselves from "pigs." Albert, a principal CAPBOM suspect and long time friend of CAPBOM suspect Judy Lee Hembler, aka Judy Gumbo, was identified as being in Capital area during the week preceding CAPBOM, admits being in Washington, D. C., during time of same but denies involvement in bombing.





Because existing information logically points to those previously named, it is considered essential to exhaust every effort to determine whether they were, in fact, perpetrators of the bombing. Lacking physical evidence from which to proceed, it is necessary to conduct extensive and complete investigation of these suspects prior to and subsequent to the bombing to try to resolve the matter. Bearing in mind the parallel existing security investigations being conducted, it is believed desirable that investigation hereinafter detailed be handled by the case agent assigned to the security subject involved to eliminate overlap and unnecessary duplication of effort. This, of course, will require the case agent to thoroughly familiarize himself with Capbom and suspected role of his subject. Any additional information in this regard needed by auxiliary offices in the Capbom case may be obtained from office of origin, WFO.

A complete and in-depth review of all information in your files concerning these individual subjects is to be made by the office of origin. A similar review of all information in Bureau files concerning these individual subjects is being accomplished.

Intensification of the investigations on these individual subjects should include, but not be limited to, development of the following concerning Capbom:

1. Information which would prove or disprove individual's participation in or knowledge of Capbom.
2. Information which would facilitate targeting an informant against the individual.
3. Information pointing toward a solid penetrating interview of individual under secure conditions.

In connection with your review of all information in your files relating to the individual subjects and subsequent investigation, the following information, which is not all inclusive, should be obtained:

1. Whereabouts of the individual for six months prior to the bombing.

2. Contacts the individual had with any of the others listed above during a period of six months prior to the hearing.
3. The individual's means of financial support.
4. Whether the individual is less active or less enthusiastic about the New Left movement than in the past.
5. Associates of the individual who would possibly be developed as informants to target against him.

Despite the recent appellate court ruling that [redacted] arrest in connection with the grand jury action in Boston was not valid (stated Government did not provide sufficient facts establishing probable cause she would not consent to subpoena), grand jury action against all of these individuals should be considered as a possibility. It is noted that grand jury action is generally a matter of internal security.

Officers of origin of individuals listed should move immediately to implement these instructions. Within two weeks (10/21/71), an office of origin, your information concerning your individual subject should be submitted to the Bureau by airtel under caption with a copy designated for individual case in the field and at the Bureau. SO, as office of origin, should be furnished an information copy, as well; leads should be set out to acquire information not locally available; and your recommendations should be submitted as to a proposed course of action against your individual subject. This office, at no less than two-week intervals, a progress factor setting out your additional efforts should be furnished to the Bureau in the caption case with copies to Bureau files on the individual subjects until a point is reached where no affirmative direct action, such as targeting, is warranted. The individual or approaching him for interview, as stated.

Possible interaction developed relative to the security investigations of these individual subjects should be included in appropriate security reports, when due.

Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA), NYC, at 9:25 PM on Eastern Airlines Flight 445, scheduled to arrive in Miami, Florida at 2:52 AM, August 3, 1971.

JERRY CLYDE RUBIN is publicly known as a member of the Chicago Seven and a leader of the Youth International Party (YIP).

The YIP, also known as Yippies, is a loosely knit, anti-establishment, revolutionary youth organization formed in NYC in January, 1968.

On August 2, 1971, SAs of the FBI observed RUBIN and ALBERT arrive at Atlanta International Airport, Atlanta, Georgia, at 11:35 PM, aboard Eastern Airlines Flight Number 445. They then transferred to Eastern Flight Number 455 which departed Atlanta at 1:30 AM bound non stop for Miami.

At 2:45 AM, August 3, 1971, a Special Agent (SA) of the FBI observed RUBIN and ALBERT arrive at Miami International Airport on Eastern Airlines Flight 455 from Atlanta. They proceeded to the Braniff International (BI) ticket counter and, after having their tickets validated, boarded BI Flight Number 979. This flight departed Miami at 3:30 AM, bound for Panama City, Quito, Lima, La Paz and Santiago with a scheduled arrival at Santiago, Chile of 4:50 PM on August 3, 1971.

On September 24, 1971, [REDACTED] NYC, advised that JERRY RUBIN and STEWART ALBERT boarded BI Flight 984 at 11:10 PM (Greenwich Mean Time) on September 23, 1971, at Lima, Peru, enroute to NYC and arrived at Miami, Florida at 8:40 AM, September 24, 1971.

On September 24, 1971, [REDACTED] NYC, advised that RUBIN and ALBERT were listed on the manifest of Eastern Flight 14, which departed Miami, Florida at 11:00 AM, September 24, 1971 and arrived at JFKIA, NYC at 1:33 PM that date.

On November 5, 1971, New York [REDACTED] ALBERT was present at demonstrations in Washington, D.C., October 25-29, 1971, sponsored by Peoples Coalition For Peace and Justice (PCPJ). Source stated that ALBERT stayed closed to the leadership but did not make any speeches.

A PCPJ press release dated March 1, 1971, described the PCPJ as being headquartered in Washington, D.C. and consisting of over 100 organizations which are using massive, non-violent, civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression and war.

On November 5, 1971, a march and rally held in NYC by the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) was observed by a SA of the FBI. The group began gathering in the garment district at West 38th Street and Avenue of the Americas at approximately 10:00 AM. At 11:00 AM, it began marching north on the Avenue of the Americas toward Central Park. Approximately midway through the march, ALBERT appeared among the group and marched with it to the Park. At the Park, ALBERT was joined by LESLIE BACON. The NPAC then proceeded to the corner of 64th Street and Madison Avenue, where they attempted to burn Governor NELSON ROCKEFELLER in effigy. ALBERT and BACON were observed remaining behind in the Park.

The NPAC was founded in 1970 by members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Its basic objective is to unite masses of people including labor unions, GIs and the black community in the struggle to end United States intervention in Southeast Asia through orderly and peaceful tactics.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

LESLIE BACON has been publicly known as a member of the YIP and is currently under Federal indictment for conspiracy to firebomb the First National City Bank, 91st Street and Madison Avenue, NYC, on December 4, 1970.





Set forth below are the results of the informants canvass at New York. Also included is additional data regarding suspects [REDACTED] ALBERT and HEMBLEN.


New York is presently Office of Origin in the matters of [REDACTED] ALBERT and HEMBLEN. Under separate headings, these three individuals are analyzed and investigative/intelligence programs regarding these three, aimed at the solution of CAPBOM, and successful criminal prosecution of those responsible, is included as the conclusion of the character analyses of [REDACTED] ALBERT and HEMBLEN. This investigative/intelligence program will be put into effect at New York immediately UACB.





II. STEWART EDWARD ALBERT

to [REDACTED] ALBERT was known during which time he occasionally visited [REDACTED] Office in New York City. [REDACTED] in contact with ALBERT [REDACTED] observed ALBERT at demonstrations in New York City during June, 1971.

ALBERT appeared to be deeply committed to the "Movement" as this was his only source of identity. He appeared to be an easy-going person.

The current involvement of ALBERT in the New Left movement is unknown.

Subject's organizational activity at the present time seems to be limited to the PCRJ. he did not attend the YIP meeting at Madison, Wisconsin, 1/8 and 1/9/71. ALBERT seems to be making very little tangible contribution in such areas as organizing and speech-making. He is widely known among New Left rank and file and is closely acquainted with the leadership such as JERRY RUBIN, JUDY GUMBO and . However, he appears to be more of a writer and confidant than a leader in his own right. ALBERT generally does not maintain his own residence, but rather takes advantage of his close association with such New Left figures as , RUBIN and GUMBO to stay at their apartments.



The investigative program to establish whether ALBERT is criminally involved in the bombing of the Capitol Building, to be conducted at New York in the immediate future, includes the following:

An attempt to interview ALBERT himself, upon establishing his present whereabouts.

III. JUDITH LEE HEMBLEEN, aka Judy Gumbo

JUDY GUMBO [REDACTED] mainly during the Summer-Fall of 1970 at which time GUMBO was affiliated with the YIP National Office in New York City. [REDACTED] GUMBO during demonstrations in New York City during June, 1971.

During the Summer-Fall of 1970, GUMBO resided at the commune at Five St. Marks Place, New York City, in JERRY RUBIN's apartment. At that time [REDACTED] and occasionally JERRY RUBIN, STU ALBERT, [REDACTED] from California and [REDACTED] from Philadelphia also resided at that apartment.

At the YIP Office in New York City, GUMBO was associated with [REDACTED] occasionally ALBERT [REDACTED]

GUMBO's closest associates appeared to be [REDACTED]

GUMBO is a very intelligent and well organized individual, but would be more effective but for personality defects. GUMBO was an extremely irritable bad-tempered person who was not very well liked by "Movement" people. She made herself extremely hard to like. She was well versed in Maoism. She also was a smoker of "grass" (marijuana).

[REDACTED] GUMBO appeared to be deeply involved in the New Left Movement. Her current involvement is unknown [REDACTED]

During March, 1970-August, 1970, GUMBO resided in Apartment Three at 2 Albermarle Street, Boston, Massachusetts.

During October, 1971, to December, 1971, GUMBO resided at 306 East Sixth Street, New York City, Apartment 1-West, New York City. She departed New York City reportedly for Austin, Texas, early in December, 1971. Early in December, 1971, [REDACTED] moved into Apartment 1-West at 306 East Sixth Street, New York City.

GUMBO's closest associates during 1970-72 have been [REDACTED]

With respect to interrelated contacts by the suspects, it is noted that GUMBO resided with [REDACTED] at Five St. Marks Place, New York City, during the summer-fall of 1970, during which time both were affiliated with the YIP in New York City. [REDACTED] was reported to have been residing with GUMBO at 306 East Sixth Street, New York City, during November, 1971, and to have moved into that apartment occupied by GUMBO early in December, 1971. Also, STEWART ALBERT reportedly resided on occasions at Five St. Marks Place, New York City, during October, 1970. ALBERT and GUMBO both attended a court hearing in New York City on 1/6/71, and demonstrations in New York City on 6/8/71 and 6/15/71. Also, GUMBO and [REDACTED] participated in demonstrations in New York City on 9/13/71, 9/18/71 and 9/20/71.

Concerning finances it is noted that GUMBO is not known to be employed. The rent on the apartment she occupies is paid for by Attorney [REDACTED]

It is believed that GUMBO continues to be deeply committed to the New Left Movement.

The investigative/intelligence program regarding GUMBO parallels the program outlined for [REDACTED] inasmuch as [REDACTED] and GUMBO are presently residing together and are known to have common associates. Consideration is being given to requesting Bureau authority for the establishing of a telephone surveillance at Apartment 1-west, 306 East Sixth Street, New York City, New York. The telephone located there, installed 11/30/71, is in the name of J. GUMBO.

It is noted that attempts have been made in the past to interview JUDY GUMBO, however, during these attempts GUMBO, inside her apartment, was able to avoid facing the interviewing agents, and made the statement, "See my attorney" through the door. Another attempt will be made to interview GUMBO at New York. This attempt will take place while GUMBO is on the street or getting into a car. A face-to-face confrontation is deemed worthwhile.

[REDACTED] as in the matter of [REDACTED] will be targeted against GUMBO.

JERRY RUBIN and STU ALBERT were guests on a talk show broadcast over radio station WBUS on the late evening of February 15, 1972. The program consisted of music with a counter-culture theme.

RUBIN indicated he and ALBERT had recently been in Chile which he described as having more political freedom than the United States.

Both fielded a number of questions from the listening audience. In response to one, RUBIN commented that every FBI Agent is a potential defector from the FBI; that the FBI should be abolished.

He stated that today he probably would not perform some of his more bizarre acts as he had in the past, such as appearing on a television show in judicial robes, then doffing the robes and trampling on them. He remarked that political protest by the youth culture is currently muted but far from dead.

At several points in the program he expressed contempt for the Democratic presidential candidates with the exception of ~~WALTER CREECH~~.

When a caller requested support of RUBIN for "Operation Snowplow" he stated he had no knowledge of the project. When it was explained to him that it was a nonpartisan effort to feed, house and transport youthful demonstrators who may come to the National Democratic Convention, he said that he would support the concept. Shortly after midnight while still on the air, a bomb threat was received at the radio station.

"Operation Snowplow" is a non-political coalition of Miami organizations whose purpose is to provide food, shelter and medical service to non-delegate youth groups who may come to Miami for the Democratic National Convention.



February 16, 1972

JERRY RUBIN held a press conference on February 16, 1972 in front of the Miami Beach Convention Hall, the site of the forthcoming Democratic National Convention. Because of the bomb threat received during his broadcast the previous night, RUBIN was apprehensive that unfriendly elements might disrupt the press conference. He requested a local activist to be present and to serve as his bodyguard.



RUBIN during the press conference, stated he and STU ALBERT knew people in Miami who have planned demonstrations during the Democratic National Convention in July, 1972. He remarked all probably remember what happened four years ago and that he thought the Yippies along with the people in the streets defeated the Democratic Party and that Yippies from all over the country will be coming to Miami.

There will be 10,000 Yippies marching naked in front of the convention hall there is going to be marijuana smoked everywhere we will not tolerate the nomination of HUMPHREY, MUSKIE, JACKSON or WALLACE.

RUBIN said he hopes its peaceful. There will be no point for violence. He heard the police are taking sensitivity training classes and that is good. It was the police who made it violent in Chicago. If there is any violence, it will cost the Democrats the election. RUBIN said they are coming in numbers to make their presence

felt and express themselves and if the police attack or do not give a permit, then all the bombs are their responsibility.

From Miami we're going to march to San Diego there will be a million people in San Diego who will surround the Republican National Convention and make it totally impossible for RICHARD M. NIXON to be re-elected.

RUBIN stated that every kid is going to want to spend their summer in Miami and San Diego and though campuses are quiet all kinds of high school kids and college kids will come to those cities Miami will probably have the biggest demonstrations it has ever had we're on a speaking tour throughout Florida we will stay here to work with local people in making it happen.

RUBIN was asked concerning Chief of Police (Miami Beach) POMERANCE's statement that the minute they break the law they will be thrown in jail. RUBIN responded by saying the moment he breaks the law we'll throw him in jail. He'll be the lawbreaker not us he'll have the heaviest artillery but we'll have moral, spiritual power on our side.

RUBIN stated they were planning a non-violent celebration the Democrats paid a big price in 1968 they don't want to repay that price in 1972 they do not want violence they can avoid this by giving us march permits and a place to assemble.

RUBIN stated there will be enough food for everyone, housing and dope we hope the person the Democrats nominate for president comes out on to this lawn and gets stoned with us everyone smokes dope now the delegates will be smoking dope some of the candidates smoke dope. Check out the odor in the smoke-filled rooms.

RUBIN remarked that his base of operations will be Miami Beach, Florida, but admitted he does not have an office as yet.

RUBIN was asked if he was committed to a non-violent protest and he said yes. He stated to him violence is capitalism.

RUBIN stated that SHIRLEY CHISHOLM was a most acceptable political candidate for the presidency. She represents black people, women, poor people, ghetto people and people on the bottom. She has no chance because she is not acceptable to the middle-aged male politicians that are going to dominate the convention and produce probably MUSKIE who is just another version of RICHARD NIXON.

RUBIN stated that the Brooklyn Liberation Front will be down people from Brooklyn usually create a stir they're not quiet and soft-spoken so we imagine Miami is going to look a little like Brooklyn.

RUBIN again remarked he expected 20,000 to march naked and he has a commitment from JOHN LINDSAY and HUBERT HUMPHREY to join the march.

When asked if he would wear a NIXON button, RUBIN responded by saying RICHARD NIXON is helping the cause of communism by going to China he is helping Chinese influence throughout the world he is influencing communism throughout America. He has been anti-communist all his life, but just to get re-elected he will do anything he'll go to China to sell the whole country to communism RUBIN stated he would put on a NIXON button because NIXON is a secret member of the Communist Party and in China he is going to say that he has been a Marxist-Leninist all his life.

When questioned concerning Chief of Police POMERANCE's statement that they would go to jail if they break the law, RUBIN responded by stating Mayor DALEY (Chicago, Illinois) said that and was very foolish POMERANCE does not want to be another Mayor DALEY

STU ALBERT then spoke and stated that the Democrats are different from the Republicans, but they will have to

prove it the only way they can do that is by setting a date NIXON has not set a date and that is why the war is continuing we're going to demand that the Democrats set a date that their candidate for the presidency sets a date and lets the American people know what that date is before the election.

ALBERT remarked they're going to bring as many people as they can to Miami to force the Democratic Party and their candidate to set the date.

February 19, 1972

The February 20, 1972 issue of "The Miami Herald" contained an article entitled "Sunshine Special Streaks Into Miami". This article concerned a campaign train of Senator EDMUND MUSKIE that traveled from Jacksonville to Miami with the senator aboard.

The article stated that JERRY RUBIN had boarded the train in West Palm Beach with press credentials apparently obtained from a Rolling Stone's Washington correspondent. Yippie activist JERRY RUBIN interrupted the senator repeatedly and heckled his remarks at the various whistle stops. MUSKIE ultimately wound up scolding RUBIN and cut short his remarks after snapping at RUBIN, "You don't want to hear what I think; you don't want to dialogue. You're just here to disrupt the meeting".

February 20, 1972

JERRY RUBIN had scheduled a meeting of the Miami Liberation Front to take place February 23, 1972 at the UM to discuss plans for the forthcoming Democratic National Convention. RUBIN was advised that he was premature and the meeting was cancelled. He remarked "I don't understand".

RUBIN reportedly departed Miami destined for New York, New York and was expected to watch the telecast of the "Mike Douglas Show" that was broadcast on February 22, 1972. RUBIN appeared in the program which had been taped some weeks earlier.

Leslie Bacon has been publicly known as a member of the YIP and is currently under federal indictment for conspiracy to firebomb the First National City Bank, 61st Street and Madison Avenue, NYC, on December 4, 1970.



Upon recontact, [redacted] upon further recollection this statement was overheard in August, 1971 at a local bar. [redacted] the statement possibly was made by [redacted] of the "Fifth Estate", which is the largest circulated underground newspaper in Detroit. [redacted] is hostile toward law enforcement and has stated on numerous occasions that he would never appear before a grand jury.



On December 10, 1971, Albert, accompanied by [redacted] a leader of May Day Collective (MDC) and Peoples Coalition For Peace and Justice (PCPJ), departed NYC en route to Ann Arbor, Michigan. Albert and [redacted] possibly traveled in a 1968 gold Chevrolet, bearing New York License 6796 KU, belonging to [redacted] mother.



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The MDC in NYC is publicly known as an organization that participated in demonstrations in Washington, D.C. (WDC) during first week of May, 1971 sponsored by the PCPJ. The MDC in NYC has been inactive since September, 1971.

A PCPJ press release dated March 1, 1971, described the PCPJ as being headquartered in WDC and consisting of over 100 organizations which are using massive, non-violent, civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression and war.

Albert and [REDACTED] were in WDC for unknown reasons during the week of December 28, 1971. [REDACTED] he had heard nothing more concerning the trip which Albert and [REDACTED] are believed to have taken to Ann Arbor, Michigan on December 10, 1971.
