AT BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA: Will contact informants who are familiar with the activities of the type in which ALBERT has been involved to determine if it is known he planned to go to Chicago and/or did in fact go to Chicago at the time of the Democratic National Convention.

Selective Service Status

ALBERT was registered with Local Board 39, New York City. He has Selective Service Number 50-39-39-748. On September 18, 1963, he was found not qualified for induction on the basis of verified convulsive or pseudoconvulsive disorder. He was classified 1-Y as not physically qualified for military service and this, as of November, 1966, was still his classification.


Status of Health

ALBERT was reportedly treated for grand mal seizures with the possibility that they might be psychomotor seizures during 1962-63.



ACTIVITIES

Progressive Labor Party (PLP)



On February 21, 1966, STEWART ALBERT taught a class at the Free University of Berkeley and used as a text the book, "State and Revolution" by V. I. LENIN and also the "Russian Revolution" by MOREHEAD. In the class, ALBERT attempted to give his own views on the Stalin-Trotsky conflict.



On March 26, 1966, ALBERT was present at a demonstration held in the Civic Center Plaza, San Francisco, California, in protest against U.S. involvement in the war in Vietnam. ALBERT tended a table at which PLP literature was sold and during the demonstration attempted to get some other PLP members to challenge members of the American Nazi Party who were harrassing the demonstrators. ALBERT became involved in an argument with another individual and was overheard to state that the PLP was opposed to the CP and that CP members were not revolutionists. ALBERT stated that PLP is the only revolutionary party.

On May 14, 1966, ALBERT attended a general meeting of PLP members held at 225 Valencia Street, San Francisco. Purpose of the meeting was to hear reports from various PLP clubs and these reports would then be sent to a National Committee meeting in New York.

At this meeting a central committee was elected and the members present were broke up into four groups to discuss student activities, committee activities, labor activities and PLP publications.

In an effort to embarrass the Bureau, he would not hesitate to resort to outright lies in any account of such an interview. Also ALBERT is almost always in the company of his wife and numerous others of his type. This situation would provide an excellent opportunity for him to exhibit his contempt and disdain for the FBI in the presence of others and create as embarrassing a scene as he possibly could, including physical confrontation with Agents. He is hostile, arrogant, irrational, and very vocal and would almost certainly not cooperate.

contacted Mort Scheer, National Vice President and West Coast Organizer for the PLP, concerning work on a Free University for the Bay Area. Albert indicated that he had been with the May 2nd Movement (M2M) in New York and Scheer contacted officials of M2M in New York concerning the background of Albert. Scheer was told that Albert was "OK" but that caution should be used in dealing with him.

On March 26, 1966, Albert was present at a demonstration held in the Civic Center Plaza, San Francisco, California, in protest against U. S. involvement in the war in Vietnam. Albert tended a table at which PLP literature was sold and during the demonstration attempted to get some other PLP members to challenge members of the American Nazi Party who were harassing the demonstrators. Albert became involved in an argument with another individual and was overheard to state that the PLP was opposed to the Communist Party (CP) and that CP members were not revolutionists. Albert stated that the PLP is the only revolutionary party.

[REDACTED] Albert attended a general meeting of PLP members held at 225 Valencia Street, San Francisco. The purpose of the meeting was to hear reports from various PLP clubs and these reports would then be sent to a National Committee meeting in New York.

On May 15, 1966, Stewart Albert attended a meeting of Progressive Labor members held at 2929 - 16th Street, San Francisco. At this meeting a central committee was elected and the members present were broke up into four groups to discuss student activities, committee activities, labor activities and PLP publications.



Interviewing Agents declined to enter into a conversation of that type with ALBERT, and since it was apparent that he was no longer interested in further discussion of the matter at hand, Agents discontinued the interview.

STEWART ALBERT was arrested on 10/24/68 along with 70 others during a sit-in demonstration on the campus of the University of California, Berkeley, Calif. He was charged with disturbing the peace, trespass, and malicious mischief. He was released on \$1,650 bail and the case was continued until a later unspecified date. ALBERT was interviewed 10/28/68 but denied any intention or actual part in any attempt to disrupt the Democratic National Convention in Chicago and he denied any physical part in any riot or violence.

STEWART ALBERT was interviewed at his residence, 1049 Keith Avenue, Berkeley, California, on October 28, 1968.

He was advised that this investigation was being conducted at the direction of Mr. FRED M. VINSON, JR., Assistant Attorney General of the U. S., in charge of the Criminal Division, U. S. Department of Justice. He was advised that he had the right to remain silent and that anything he might say could be used against him in court. He was also advised that he had the right to seek the advice of a lawyer before answering any questions and to have him present during the questioning. ALBERT was also advised that if he could not afford a lawyer, one would be appointed before any questioning began.

STEWART ALBERT was given a printed copy of his rights and a waiver of these rights. He read both items and said that he understood them, but did not need the services of a lawyer and declined to sign the waiver. He said that he would reserve the right to ask the Agents to leave at any time.

STEWART ALBERT admitted his identity and stated that he is occupied as a journalist for the "Berkeley Barb" and other underground publications.

ALBERT advised that he had travelled from New York to Chicago in August, 1968, for the purpose of participating in a demonstration to protest what he and the "Yippies" consider to be the nomination of a candidate at the Democratic National Convention who would carry on policies of the present administration, specifically that dealing with the Vietnam war.

He stated that he had not entered into any plan to disrupt the Democratic National Convention in Chicago, primarily because he felt that it could not be done with the great number of police and National Guard which he knew would be present to discourage such a thing. He said that inasmuch as the ideological hero of the "Yippies" is GROUCHO MARX of Marx Brothers fame

Instead of KARL MARX, it was his idea to stage a spectacular demonstration based on the theme of "A Night at the Opera", a Marx Brothers production.

ALBERT said he had no personal part in any riot or violence and could furnish no information in that regard. He said that although he had been struck by someone whom he assumed was a policeman, he did not attempt to strike back and did not throw any objects. According to ALBERT, his arrest by the Chicago police came about when he and several others were carrying a live pig into the demonstration.

ALBERT reiterated that at no time in New York prior to his departure for Chicago, or in Chicago prior to or during the Democratic National Convention, did he plan or advocate riot, violence or disruption of the Democratic National Convention.

He stated that this person as well as other individuals, came [REDACTED] from "The Seed," a Hippie type newspaper, published in the Chicago area, [REDACTED] volunteered to furnish rooming space to those individuals during the DNC. [REDACTED] related that he advised the above individuals that he had cooperated with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the past and exhibited to them an article which appeared in the "Saturday Evening Post" in 1968, dealing with his association with the FBI. He advised that as a consequence because of this article, none of these individuals, including ALBERT included him in their discussion concerning their plans and activities during the DNC. He related that he did not personally observe ALBERT or the others connected with any demonstration or disturbance occurring during the DNC.

would like to have the opportunity to interview police and Agents regarding training, investigative techniques, political philosophy of personnel, racial and religious ratios, etc. He then launched into a bitter attack on [REDACTED] for the part he played in events in Chicago.

To all of this, interviewing Agents offered no advice or comment. However, at one point, ALBERT stated the FBI never investigates police departments for their "abusive techniques designed to intimidate Negroes". This point was flatly refuted and it was pointed out to ALBERT the FBI does investigate such allegations under civil rights statutes.

STEWART ALBERT was interviewed at his residence, 1049 Keith Avenue, Berkeley, California, on November 26, 1968. When an attempt was made to advise him of his rights, he stated that he was aware of his rights as had been related to him by the same interviewing Agents at an earlier date.

In connection with the "live pig incident" in Chicago on August 28, 1968, ALBERT stated that since his own arrest by Chicago police for that particular incident had not been resolved, he would not discuss any part of the "live pig incident", except to say that it had been intended as a satirical prank and not meant to stir up the crowd. He would not say how the pig got on the scene, nor would he discuss any person connected with the incident.

When ALBERT was questioned about the snake dance technique being taught, he replied, "What is a snake dance?" He then went on to say that if it is "one of those serpentine things", he did not see anyone being taught that type of thing, nor did he know of anyone being taught karate and defensive tactics. In that connection, ALBERT stated that he was at a loss to understand how anything like a snake dance could be used as an offensive or defensive measure against a police line. He said that he was mildly familiar with karate, and he was certain that if anyone had been teaching karate and defensive tactics it would be time wasted because he knew that little, if any, progress could be made during the short period of time available. He said that in any event he knew nothing about that phase of the demonstrations in Chicago.

He said that the only type of physical activity he saw in Lincoln Park in Chicago was organized calisthenics, and that this was pictured in newspapers and on television.

There have been no instances of the snake dance or "live pig technique" being used in demonstrations in the San Francisco, Oakland or Berkeley areas prior to the August 28, 1968 incident in Chicago.

However, on November 5, 1968, at a demonstration in the Civic Center Plaza, San Francisco, the demonstrators had a live pig called "Pigasus" in a crate on a flat bed truck which served as the speaker's platform. During the time Stewart Albert was speaking, someone urged him to release the pig, but Albert declined and said that the pig would be released at the right tactical time. He then told the unidentified man that if that was his "bag", he could release the pig.

Later someone did release the pig, which wandered around for about one half hour and was then recaptured by spectators and brought back to the speaker's platform. The only emotion displayed by the crowd during this time was mild laughter.

The crowd then urged that the pig again be set free and someone again released the pig. Shortly thereafter the pig was captured by the San Francisco Police, who called the San Francisco Humane Society. When the Humane Society representatives arrived, one of the demonstrators ran to the speaker's platform and shouted, "they are arresting our pig". In spite of this attempt to arouse the crowd, only about eight or ten demonstrators came to the nearby area where the pig was caught and quietly watched the Humane Society officers place him in a cage in their truck.

The above was witnessed by a Special Agent of the FBI.

4. The date the subject first arrived in Chicago.

In respect to these requests, a file review determined the following:

In Chicago report of SA [REDACTED] dated 10/31/68, page 6, [REDACTED] advised that ALBERT resided at this address during part of the month of August, 1968, which period included the days encompassing the Democratic National Convention. It is noted that though not included in this FD-302 [REDACTED] was specifically questioned regarding a more precise date of ALBERT's arrival and how he arrived at this address. However, [REDACTED] could not be more specific. Therefore, no lead is being set forth in regards to interviewing [REDACTED] about this matter.

In San Francisco report of SA [REDACTED] dated 10/29/68, captioned as above, the following information is contained on page 3, paragraph 5:

In interviewing ALBERT, he stated in particular that he had traveled from New York to Chicago in August of 1968 for the purpose of participating in a demonstration to protest what he and the "Yippies" consider to be the nomination of a candidate at the Democratic National Convention who would carry on policies of the present administration, specifically that dealing with the Vietnam War.

AT BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA. Since ALBERT has at least been cordial in the past concerning these matters, it is suggested that he be recontacted to determine the above requested information. If ALBERT declines, then

San Francisco should set forth necessary leads to determine this information and conduct any other logical investigation to develop this information, such as inquiry at 1049 Keith Avenue, or at the address of his wife.

NEW YORK

AT NEW YORK CITY, NEW YORK. Will conduct investigation at ALBERT's address to determine exactly when he left for Chicago, Illinois, and mode of travel.

It is noted that ALBERT has been interviewed on three occasions concerning the activities surrounding the Democratic National Convention. In each of the interviews ALBERT was quite aware that he was the subject of an ARL investigation and the only direct answers he gave were negative and self serving. All other answers were of a general nature.

ALBERT has not been cordial in these interviews and grudgingly submits to them. Anytime the questioning takes a turn that he doesn't like he will then start making flippant and provocative remarks obviously designed to goad the interviewing agents. When his wife is present she is very hostile and has refused to answer questions, even concerning her identity. The house at 1049 Keith Avenue, Berkeley, is rented by [redacted] an unidentified woman and an infant child. During past interviews there have been other people in the house and can overhear the interview. This constitutes an audience for ALBERT and he does not hesitate to take advantage of it by trying to embarrass the interviewing Agents. He always declines to be interviewed elsewhere.

The above is set out to show that continued interviews with ALBERT can serve no good purpose and can only succeed in demeaning and embarrassing the Bureau and the interviewing Agents.

As for further investigation at 1049 Keith Avenue, subject's present address, it is noted that ALBERT did not reside there prior to his departure for New York in 1967 and has lived there only since his return to Berkeley following the Democratic National Convention. His wife also resides there.

[REDACTED]  
advised September 18, 1968, that the ALBERTS were not residents of 1049 Keith Avenue at that time.

Since the ALBERTS had not resided at the above address until after his return from Chicago and since his wife, who also resides there is hostile, there is no logical investigation to be conducted at that address or in the San Francisco Division.

Because of the facts as set out above concerning interviews with ALBERT, he is not being contacted UACB.

On 1/20/69, a telephone call was placed to 1049 Keith Avenue, Berkeley, Calif., where ALBERT had been living. An unknown woman answered and said that ALBERT no longer was living there and was very vague and evasive about when he had moved out and where he was currently living. She advised that she could not get a message to him and had no telephone number for him although she knew that he was living in Berkeley.

A call was then placed to the office of the "Berkeley Barb", for whom ALBERT is a writer and ALBERT was not there at the time. Agents requested that the unknown man take a message for ALBERT and have him call a number, which was that of the Berkeley RA. When the unknown man was given the Agents names, he said, "You're FBI Agents, aren't you?" Agents replied in the affirmative. Unknown man then said, "I'll give him the message but I don't think he'll return your call". He did not give the address or telephone number at which ALBERT could be reached.

It is noted that frequent telephone contacts have been made to ALBERT's last address since 1/9/69, but there was either no answer or persons accepting the call said ALBERT was out of town.

The "Berkeley Barb" of 1/17-23/69 carries an article by ALBERT in which he says he was present at the opening of the trial of the "Oakland Seven", which was 1/13/69 in Oakland, California. In the past two issues of the "Berkeley Barb" articles have appeared under ALBERT's byline which refer to "four" contacts with him by FBI Agents and also that "the FBI has been giving me a hard time ever since" the Chicago convention.

In view of the foregoing, it would seem likely that ALBERT is attempting to avoid further contact and has discussed the matter with persons at his former residence and at the "Berkeley Barb", where all are attempting to conceal his whereabouts. Efforts to locate and interview continuing.
